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- 1. Credit for coursework completed at career centers will be awarded if
 - a. A formal articulation agreement exists between Missouri State University-West Plains and the career center.
 - b. The career center is state accredited.
- 2. Only 700-1050 clock-hour programs will be considered for credit. These programs are typically completed in one year for adult programs and two years for high school programs.
- 3. Students must attain a 'C' grade or better in the applicable course work to receive credit.
- 4. Up to 24 credit-hours may be awarded from a career center.
- 5. Credit for this course will be transcripted upon completion of 12 credit-hours of coursework at Missouri State University-West Plains.
- The career center programs will appear on the Missouri State University-West Plains as one 24 credit-hour FCA 160 course (900-1050 clock-hour culinary arts program), one 24 credit-hour TEC 120 course (900-1050 clock-hour technical programs) or one 18 credit-hour AGR 150 course (700 clock-hour agriculture programs.)
- 7. A 'P' (passing) letter grade will be assigned for these courses on the student's transcript.

- 9. The completed form must be submitted to the Missouri State University-West Plains office of registration and records.
- 10. Confirmation of the course information will be made from the student's high school transcript.
- 11. Credit for the approved course(s) will be included on the student's Missouri State University-West Plains transcript.
- 12. The transferability of these courses must be confirmed because they may not be accepted for credit at other institutions.
- 13. The student will be notified via University email when credit has been awarded.
- 14. The credit-hours awarded for career center programs may be applied toward the following degrees:
 - TEC 120 Associate of Applied Science (AAS) in Technology General Technology Option: 24 credit-hours.
 - b. FCA 160 Associate of Applied Science (AAS) in Entrepreneurship Culinary Arts Option: 24 credit-hours.
 - c. AGR 150 Associate of Applied Science (AAS) in General Agriculture: 18 credit-hours.
 - d. A portion of the 18-24 credit-hours may be applied toward electives in other programs, depending on the program.
