Subject: Important Notice: Higher Learning Commission Probation Status

Dear Missouri State University-West Plains faculty and staff,

I am writing to inform you that our accreditor, Higher Learning Commission (HLC), has now officially placed Missouri State University-West Plains on probation.

This decision follows a comprehensive evaluation by the HLC during which officials noted the university was out of compliance with one of the criteria for accreditation and needs to address three other areas of concern. As you know, we have been working to address these issues promptly and effectively, but we have much to do ahead of us.

As you interact with students and the community concerning this sanction, here are a few key points to understand about the probation status:

- 1. **Accreditation Status**: While we are on probation, Missouri State University-West Plains remains accredited.
- 2. **Reasons for Probation**: The HLC has highlighted specific areas where we need to enhance our practices and procedures. We are carefully reviewing these areas and are already developing a comprehensive plan to address each one.
- 3. **Commitment to Improvement**: Our primary goal is to ensure that we meet and exceed the standards set by the HLC. We are dedicated to making the necessary improvements to provide the highest quality education and services to our students.
- 4. **Continued Support for Our Students**: Our students' education remains our top priority. We are committed to maintaining the quality of the academic experience and support services throughout this period. We as faculty, staff and administrators are here to assist our current and future students with any concerns or questions they may have.
- 5. **Next Steps**: We will be working closely with the HLC over the coming months to implement our improvement plan. Regular updates on our progress and any significant developments will be communicated throughout the campus community. We also will need to file a "comprehensive Assurance Filing [a self-assessment of how we meet HLC's standards] at least eight weeks prior to the comprehensive evaluation for Probation" and provide evidence that we have improved, in particular, our assessment of student learning and have made strides to meet the criteria that were met with concerns. We will also have another site visit by an HLC-appointed peer review team who will conduct that comprehensive evaluation for Probation, likely in November 2025.
